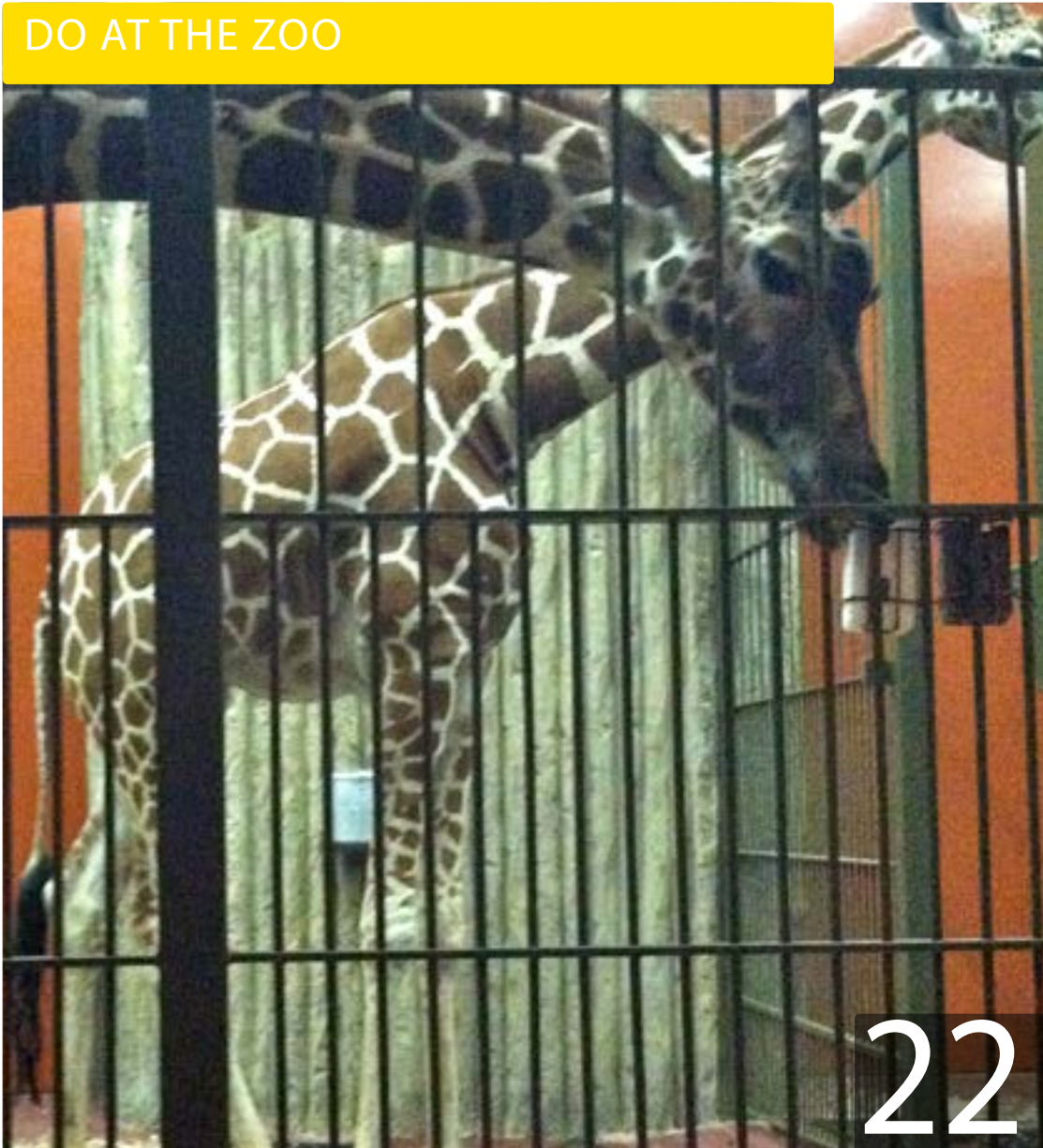

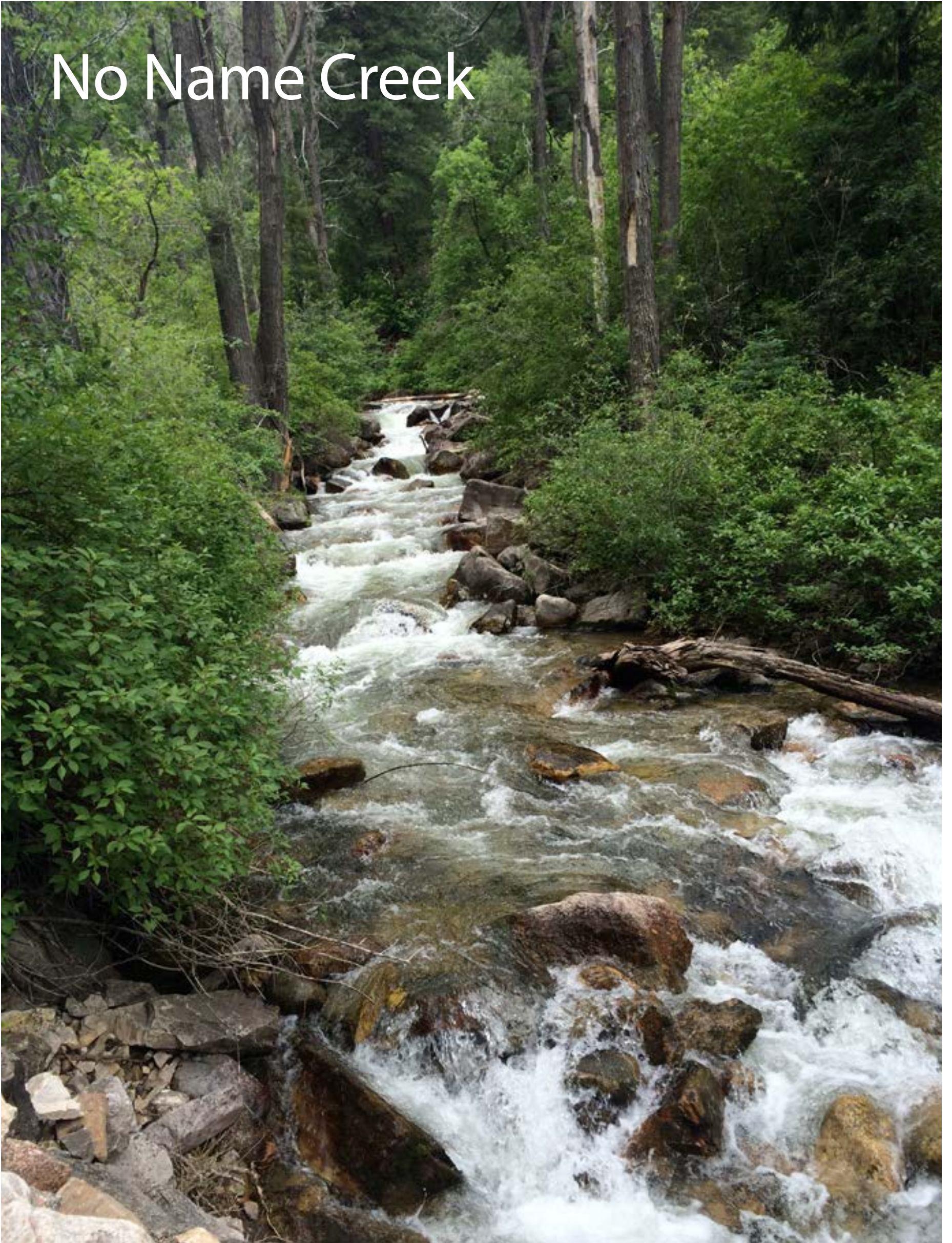

Bliss in Colorado Mountains

Colorado summers are the best time for camping. Whether you are a pro hiker who has conquered all the 14ers in the state, or you're like me and simply enjoy the tranquility of a weekend out in nature without the chaotic buzzing of cell phones and devices. Either way, if you are planning a trip out to Colorado, or even if you are native to the state, one experience that is a must is spending the night out in the mountains.

Late June, I was fortunate to spend a night camping at Glenwood Canyon Resort Campground followed by camping at the Sylvan Lake Campground. Prepping for two nights in the sticks meant making sure meals were planned (s'mores too!), plenty of sunscreen, bug spray, and Citronella Outdoor Sticks. Once the car was packed and ready to roll, we loaded up our dog and we were off.

Glenwood Canyon Resort (1308 County Road 129, Glenwood Springs, CO) is settled on the Colorado River providing the lulling sounds of rushing water throughout the night. Activities for kids of all ages are set up adjacent to the campground, including a zipline across the river and white water rafting. A challenging ropes course crosses from tower to tower 40 feet above the ground. A 40-foot rock climbing wall offers the ideal challenge for all ability levels. The resort also provides rental bikes to ride along the Glenwood Canyon Recreational Trail.

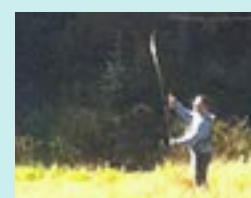
Across the interstate from the campground, the Jess Weaver Trail provides miles of hiking next to No Name Creek, and is one of the best hikes in Glenwood Canyon. The Jess Weaver Trail (a.k.a. No Name Trail) is well-defined and maintained but can be strenuous at times. Between three main canyons in Glenwood Canyon (No Name, Grizzly, and Hanging Lake), No Name is the least travelled.

The following morning, after exploring some of the natural hot springs in Glenwood Springs, we made our trek up to Sylvan Lake State Park (10200 Brush Creek Road, Eagle, CO) for night two of camping. To me, Sylvan Lake is a more laid back style of camping, unlike the activities available for campers at Glenwood. If fly fishing, canoeing, kayaking, paddle boarding, or rowing a boat is more like you, Sylvan Lake is the place for you.

The landscapes and nature at Sylvan is breathtaking with the campground settled inside a "bowl" enclosed by mountains. Chipmunks and Hummingbirds darted and fluttered around our campsite creating the true outdoorsy experience. Of course, bears probably would have done that too, but luckily there were no encounters.

While the night reached temperatures that felt just above freezing, the pure bliss during the daytime made up for it. Perhaps the greatest aspect of camping up at Sylvan was the night sky revealing infinite bright twinkling stars. Nothing makes for a better night than listening to live music by the campers next door, and enjoying s'mores by a roaring bonfire.

After thawing by the campfire the following morning to rid of the evening's chill, we rented a canoe from the Ranger Station and spent an hour paddling around Sylvan Lake. The campground offers both canoes and kayaks rentals for periods of 4 hours or the full day. The crystal clear water made viewing what was beneath the surface easy. Many campers fly fish in hopes of catching a trout or two.

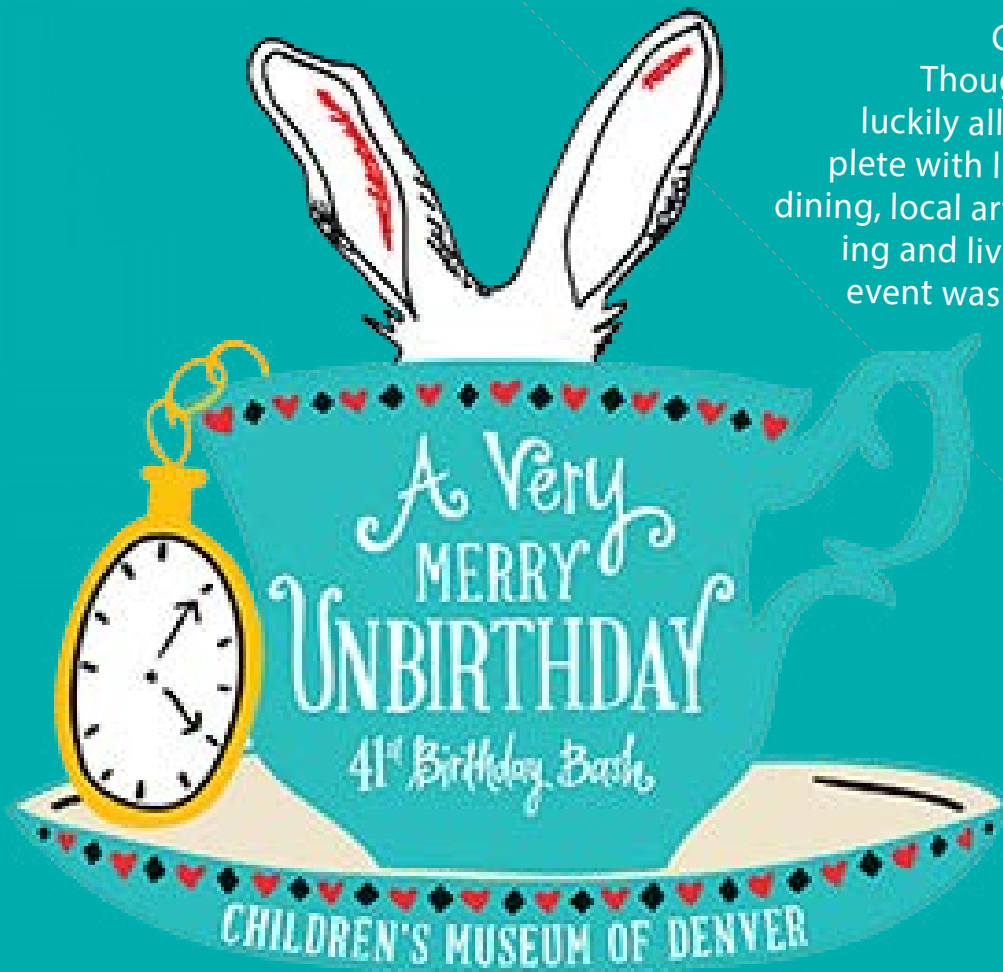




Children's Museum's 41st Birthday Bash!

The adults-only gala was held May 31, 2014 on the Children's Museum's plaza with exquisite views of Denver. Though bad weather threatened to make the event a wet one, luckily all held off and the evening went without disruption! Complete with live and silent auctions full of great getaways, wining and dining, local artwork and fanciful packages, a luxurious raffle trip, dancing and live music, cocktails, and heavy hors d'oeuvres. Though the event was strictly a 21 and over evening, Alice and the Mad Hatter made an appearance taking photos with guests.

The money raised at the Birthday Bash helped the Children's Museum succeed in its mission. Proceeds support the Museum's innovative programming, interactive exhibits, community outreach and sponsored admissions.





This year's 41st Birthday raised \$286,000. Co-chairs Katy Bante and Katie Wickliff reported that donations exceeded projections by \$10,000!

Six hundred guests attended and enjoyed live entertainment from the band Funkiphino.

Rock band O.A.R. and singer Phillip Phillips announced their joint summer tour will benefit Habitat for Humanity to support the organization's mission of providing safe, decent, affordable housing in partnership with low-income families.

"Home means everything to us. It's our DNA. It's who we are," said Marc Roberge of O.A.R. "We had the chance to meet amazing people building Habitat for Humanity homes in LA, pouring love and sweat into the foundation, taking pride in the work they were doing alongside the Habitat partner family, and it was an honor to be a part of that. Words can't properly describe the positive swell that brought to our hearts. We hope the donation from our tour will help families, like the ones we met, achieve their dreams of homeownership."

The 24-city joint tour kicks off in St. Louis on June 12 and wraps up in Atlanta on July 26. For every ticket sold, O.A.R. and Phillip Phillips will donate \$1 to Habitat. The tour will also host online auctions for a VIP experience in each city, including two premium tickets and an opportunity to meet with the artists. Proceeds from the auctions will go to local Habitat affiliates.

"My team has personally seen the incredible impact Habitat for Humanity can have on lives. We have worked on builds from the Musician's Village rebuild in New Orleans following Hurricane Katrina to local neighborhoods in my community," said Phillip Phillips. "Habitat's roots stem from my home state of Georgia but their reach is now worldwide. I am honored to partner with Habitat for Humanity in carrying out their mission - to build homes, communities and hope."

The artists will also donate 10 concert tickets to the Habitat for Humanity affiliate in each tour city, for use by Habitat volunteers and staff, as well as Habitat partner homeowner families, who they will meet at each tour stop. Habitat affiliates will be provided with space at each venue to raise awareness about their affordable housing work within their communities.

"O.A.R. and Phillip Phillips share our passion for helping low-income families realize the dream of homeownership," said Colleen Ridenhour, deputy director of corporate, foundation and institution relations for Habitat for Humanity International. "We are honored to be recognized during their summer tour and are grateful for their generosity in helping raise funds to create safe, decent, affordable housing." DID YOU KNOW...

- Polar bears are the largest land carnivore in the world.
- The largest recorded polar bear stood 11 feet (3.3 m) tall and weighed 2200 pounds (990 kg).
- Polar bears can swim up to 60 miles without resting at an average rate of six miles per hour using only their front paws.
- Polar bears feed their cubs on milk that contains 31% fat, the richest milk of any bear species.
- Polar bear fur actually has no white pigment! The reflection of light causes the fur to appear white or yellowish white.

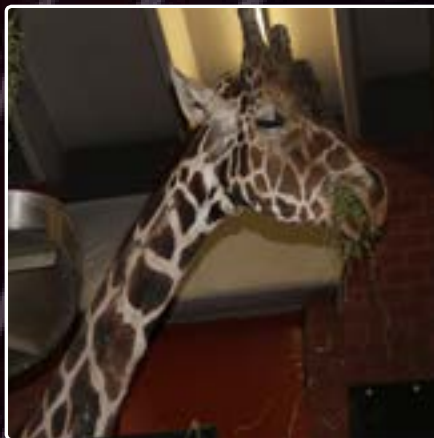
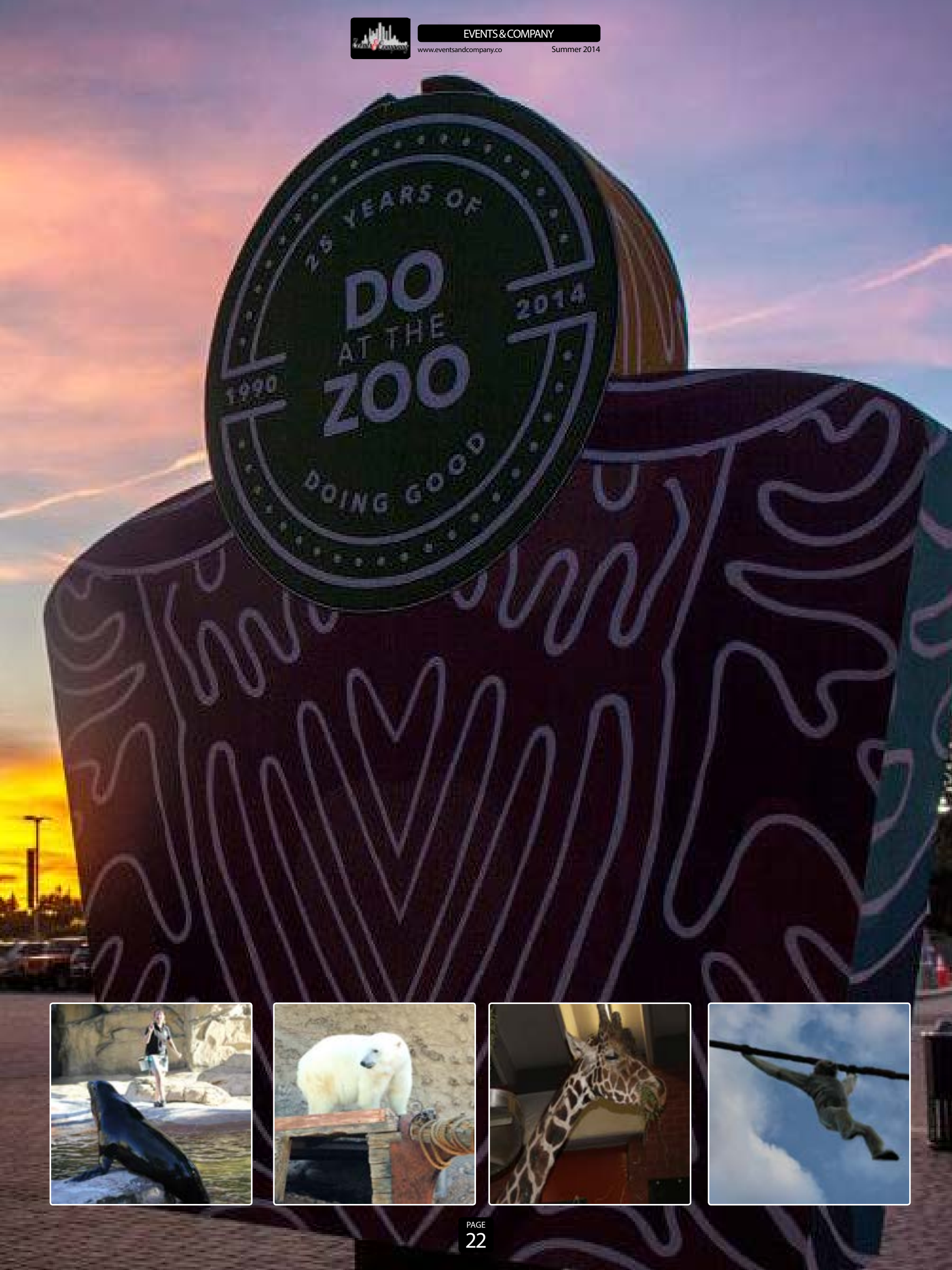

Amelia Earhart Flies Again . . . Conquers Circumnavigation in 2 weeks!

This summer, Denver's own Amelia Earhart recreated and symbolically completed her namesake's famous around the world flight.

In 1937, Amelia Mary Earhart set out to circumnavigate the globe and disappeared over the South Pacific, becoming one of history's greatest mysteries.

In 17 stops and approximately 24,300 nautical miles, Amelia flew a Pilatus PC-12 NG around the globe. Along the way Amelia honored her namesake's tenacity and love for aviation possibilities by awarding flight scholarships to young women around the country through her other passion project, the Fly With Amelia Foundation.

Amelia Rose Earhart is a passionate aviatrix, a seeker of all things adventurous and an accomplished public speaker, spending 8 years working as a television and radio reporter covering breaking news, traffic, and weather in Denver and Los Angeles. Amelia is the President of the Fly With Amelia Foundation (501c3), which grants flight-training scholarships to young women, ages 16 to 18, and fosters aviation and aerospace opportunities for people of all ages through aviation based educational curriculum.

Amelia obtained her private pilot license in February 2010, her instrument rating in a Cirrus SR-20 June of 2013, and is currently working on her commercial rating in a Cessna 182RG at Centennial Airport in Denver, CO. In the summer of 2012, Amelia completed her instrument training hours by flying from Oakland, CA to Miami, FL, tracing the final trans-continental flight of her namesake, Amelia Mary Earhart, in a Cirrus SR-20. In January of this year, Amelia flew from Stans, Switzerland to Denver, CO, crossing the North Atlantic in a Pilatus PC-12 NG, the same plane she used to circumnavigate the globe.

June 26th, Amelia Rose Earhart began the first leg of her circumnavigation departing from Oakland, CA to Denver, CO. Seventy-seven years earlier, on May 20, 1937, Amelia Mary Earhart departed from Oakland in her Lockheed Electra 10E, on an unpublicized flight to Miami, FL where she announced her intention to fly Eastbound around the globe. Amelia's destination was Miami, FL - the last place in the United States that Amelia Mary Earhart was seen before her disappearance.

Amelia Rose kept her flight updated via live stream. Amelia loves social media and she also loves staying connected to adventures in unconventional ways, which was why she wanted to live stream the flight. The cockpit of an aircraft is a place that a lot of people have never seen and this flight allowed anyone, from their computer, smartphone or tablet to come inside and experience what it is like to fly an aircraft around the world.

On July 7th, Amelia interviewed on the Today Show in Australia informing everyone that they were three quarters of the way around the world. Amelia messaged: "It is hard to believe that later today we will fly to Papua New Guinea, the last place that Amelia was seen before she disappeared... Honoring someone you've never met is an interesting thing... she didn't ask for it, she wouldn't expect it, but it honestly, it just feels right." Tribute to alpinist, Jeff Lowe

The tribute and fundraiser for pioneering, and now ailing, alpinist Jeff Lowe in Boulder on June 24 was more than a who's who list of some of the world's most influential climbers.

True, Jon Krakauer of "Into Thin Air" fame lauded a difficult Lowe climb in the Alps. Lynn Hill, who was the first person — man or woman — to free climb The Nose route on Yosemite's El Capitan said she felt an almost-familial bond with Lowe. And Michael Kennedy, who went on a 1978 expedition with Lowe and others to attempt a route on Pakistan's Latok 1 mountain, commented on Lowe's sense of humor and strength in the face of adversity.

But on a deeper level the evening was about how a strong personality and shared values like adventure can forge and strengthen the power of community, even over decades and despite hardship.

Lowe revolutionized the sport of ice climbing and was a towering figure in mountaineering during a climbing career spanning the 1950s to 2000s. During the 2000s, Lowe developed symptoms of an unknown neurodegenerative disease with characteristics similar to multiple sclerosis and amyotrophic lateral sclerosis. The 63-year-old Lowe is wheelchair-bound and requires 24-hour caregiver assistance at home.

One of the biggest takeaways of the evening for Boulderite Jean Dempsey was a sense of the climbing tribe. "When the chips are down, everyone rallies together," the 63-year-old retired physical therapist said after the roughly 2-hour program, which was held at the Boulder High School auditorium.

Between sales of roughly 350-450 tickets and an auction that included signed Lowe photographs, the evening raised about \$15,000, after expenses, that will go to supporting Lowe's home care needs, said Connie Self, Lowe's partner and one of the event organizers. The money will provide about six months of funding if Lowe's needs, which

include one full time and two part time caregivers, remain what they are now, Self said, speaking in a telephone interview after the fundraiser.

The event turned out to be more than expected, Self said, noting attendees' generosity. "We're very happy with the outcome," she said.

The first planning meeting for the fundraiser was on May 29, and the concept for the event program morphed over time, said Self, who lives in Louisville. The evening included 20 volunteers, she said. She noted the tightness of the climbing community. "We did not have to beg" for volunteers, she said.

The evening included sponsorship from nonprofits The Jeff Lowe Mountain Foundation (jeffloweclimber.com), BoulderClimbingCommunity(boulderclimbingcommunity.net) and the American Alpine Club (americanalpineclub.org).

Steven Bradley Terjak, a 55-year-old Boulder carpenter who was part of the audience at the fundraiser, said it was important for him to come to honor Lowe.

"That's essentially what's going on here: people trying to love him by doing this," said Terjak.

Flying in a B-17

with B-17 Pilot 398th Bomb Group, 603rd BS., 1st Lt. Newell D. Moy

B-17s from the Eighth Air Force participated in countless missions from bases in England. These missions often lasted for more than eight hours and struck targets deep within enemy territory. Because of their long-range capacity, formations of B-17s often flew into battle with no fighter escort, relying on their own defensive capabilities to ensure a successful mission.

During the war, B-17s were among the most modern aircraft in the U.S. inventory. However, the advent of the jet age and advances in technology made the Flying Fortress obsolete soon after the conclusion of the war. In the years following World War II, most B-17s were cut up for scrap, used in Air Force research or sold on the surplus market.

The B-17 shown above received the name Flying Fortress from a Seattle reporter who commented on its defensive

firepower. The B-17 underwent a number of improvements over its 10-year production span. Throughout the war, the B-17 was refined and improved as battle experience showed the Boeing designers where improvements could be made. The final B-17 production model, the B-17G, was produced in larger quantities (8,680) than any previous model and is considered the definite Flying Fort. With its 13 .50-caliber machine guns - chin, top, ball, and tail turrets; waist and cheek guns - the B-17G was indeed an airplane that earned respect of its combatants. In addition, air crews liked the B-17 for its ability to withstand heavy combat damage and still return its crew safely home.

Today, fewer than 100 B-17 airframes exist and fewer still are in air-worthy condition. At one time, more than 1,000 B-17s could be assembled for mass combat missions, today less than 15 of Boeing's famous bombers can still take air.

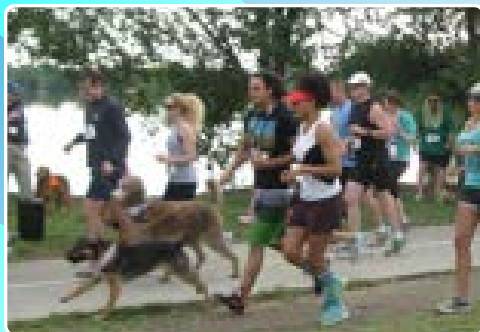

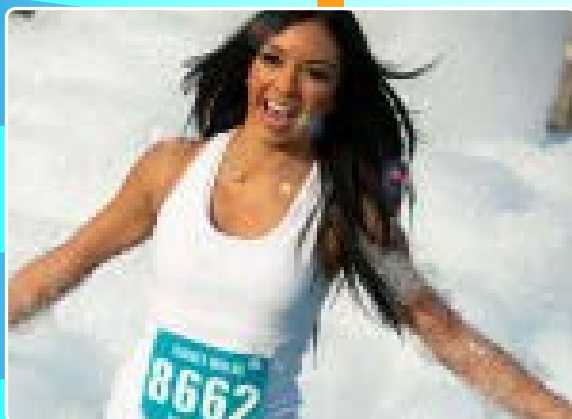
